

Vision

An inclusive town, Berri that thrives through community connections. A community that understands and activates its strengths and assets (people, organisations, spaces and things) to create strong identity and town pride where all generations feel welcomed and supported to embed and nurture a culture of positive wellbeing.



Acknowledgement of Country

Our Town Berri acknowledges that Berri is built upon the traditional land of the First Peoples of the River Murray and Mallee. Our Town Berri recognises the Erawirung People as the traditional custodians of Berri. We also pay respect to the seven Riverland Aboriginal groups Ngaiawang, Ngawait, Nganguruku, Erawirung, Ngintait, Ngaralte & Ngarkat people.

Insights

All of the work, initiatives and partnerships Our Town Berri is involved in reflects the needs of their community. In the early days of Our Town Berri's development, the Core Team engaged with their community to identify the needs voiced by locals. Here are their findings:

The light on the hill went out | Historically, Berri has had some major setbacks. We want to proudly reclaim & build our identity.

It's hard to see the river for the reeds | Services should connect & network to support the wellbeing of a community. Many are falling through the cracks.

The river connects us | When generations & groups come together, impacts are felt across a community.

Navigating uncharted waters | Life events & transitions have connections to wellbeing. Strong communities support these transitions.

Chair Report

As we wrap up another impactful year, I am excited to share the many highlights and achievements that have unfolded in Our Town Berri. Our activities across the year and partnerships underscore our commitment to community well-being, cultural pride, and social innovation.

River Families First

In our continued effort to support families through transitions, Britney has been instrumental in developing an engaging Mother's Group Program. This initiative includes activities such as art sessions with Karl Raams, nutrition workshops, and yoga classes with Jade Malinovski. The shift to a flexible, drop-in style format has been well-received, reflecting our adaptability to community needs.

Nina and Alysia from FFRR visited to review the impact of the River Families First program, which addresses the challenges posed by recent events like COVID and regional flooding. Britney's efforts have significantly contributed to the program's success, and we are grateful for the opportunity to highlight this work. We look forward to this work continuing with some exciting ideas coming up in the near future.

Regional Development Australia Murraylands and Riverland

Community Steward Julie Ahrens participated in the RDAMR Regional Leadership Development Program. This two-day workshop focused on cultivating authentic and purposeful leadership. The program emphasized self-discovery, empathy, and courage, which align with our

mission to foster local leaders and change-makers.

Reconciliation Garden

In collaboration with Berri Regional Secondary College (BRSC) and the local Aboriginal community, the Reconciliation Garden project is progressing well. Aboriginal students are engaged in constructing the garden's pathways, plantings and firepit area, gaining valuable skills and a sense of ownership. We were thrilled to receive funding from Country Arts SA for a cultural art project within the garden.

Berri Primary School Art Wellness Program

Sara's initiative at Berri Primary School has introduced a well-being-focused Art Group led by Karl Raams. This program provides a creative and supportive space for students to engage with mental health topics through art. The positive impact on students has been remarkable, fostering self-expression and personal growth.

Native Food & Culture Program

Additionally, we are funding a Native Food and Culture Program at BRSC, aimed at empowering young First Nations girls and women to explore careers in native food and agriculture.

Community Breakfasts and Friends of Berri

Core Team members Kiralee and Chris hosted community breakfasts, fostering connections with around 30 locals. Additionally, the inaugural meeting of Friends of Berri saw enthusiastic participation, discussing various community needs and opportunities for improvement.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

Earlier this year, KAIZEN Business Support facilitated an enlightening Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) training over two days. This initiative, supported by Our Town Berri, made the training accessible to many local volunteers and mentors. Our heartfelt thanks to Suzi for her exceptional facilitation and to all participants for their enthusiastic engagement. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, highlighting both the course's impact and Suzi's inspirational delivery.

Volunteering

In celebration of National Volunteers Week, we hosted a special event to honour our dedicated volunteers. Gathered around a firepit, volunteers and community members of all ages enjoyed a warm evening of appreciation and networking. A special thank you to the Berri Girl Guides for the delightful catering and to the Berri Community Centre for providing the venue.

Our Berri Regional Secondary College students have been actively engaging with the community, creating meaningful connections across generations. Their work, from teaching hockey to primary schools to recording the stories of Berri Cottage Home residents, is truly commendable. What an staggering year for volunteering, thanks to Emma's role we've seen 3000+ hours of volunteering, over 150 volunteering opportunities have been offered, 58% of students have been engaged with volunteering projects and there has been many positive outcomes for all participants.

ChangeFest

At ChangeFest, Community Steward Julie Ahrens, alongside Our Town's Strategic Leader Oli Carlton, showcased our community-led efforts, emphasizing the importance of place and collective growth. Julie's reflection on creating spaces of love and hope resonated deeply.

Innovation Space

We have been excited about the opening of the Our Town Innovation Space, a new hub designed to evolve with our community's needs. Julie and Kirste have diligently prepared this space, and we look forward to the opportunities it will bring.

Raise Mentoring

Graduating students have followed the Raise Youth Mentoring Curriculum for over 20 weeks and have focused on building resilience, school belonging, asking for help and goal setting - all positive skills for a bright future. The event is by invite only, but let's take a moment to celebrate our young mentees on their incredible journeys and to their mentors for their continued support. Carly (Raise) has also proudly noticed students learning how to form trusting relationships with older members of their community and learn to like themselves more.

Annual General Meeting and Planning Day

Last year's AGM provided a chance to reflect on the year's achievements and challenges. We welcomed Sara Ormsby and Chris Zahos to the Core Team, and are excited about the year ahead. Following the AGM, we engaged in a Planning Day with our support team, refining our Theory of Change and ensuring our initiatives align with community needs.

In closing, I want to express my gratitude for the support and dedication of our team, partners, and community members. As we look forward to the next 12 months, we remain committed to making a positive impact and continuing our journey of growth and community engagement.

River Families First

Thirteen year 8 students and volunteer mentors participated in Raise Mentoring. Students met with their mentors for one hour every Thursday throughout terms two and three with a focus on building resilience, school belonging, asking for help and goal setting – all positive skills for a bright future.

Karl Raams is an Art Therapist who has been building their business and reconnecting with their hometown after studying away.
