

As we walk towards a future where truth telling is at the core of healing and reconciliation, **Kangaroo Island Our Town** is committed to fostering conversation that puts cultural sensitivity, safety and inclusion at the forefront of everything we do.

Connecting The Dots

Our Town's mission is to equip regional communities to take control and be able to lead mental health initiatives and the vision is simple, mentally healthy regional towns.

Our Town is a ten-year, place-based mental health initiative supporting community-determined and preventative responses to mental health challenges. The Our Town initiative aims to build the capabilities of people living in rural and regional South Australian towns to support each other in the face of mental health and wellbeing challenges.

The Our Town initiative is a partnership between the Our Town communities who are supported by the Support Team (the Fay Fuller Foundation, The Australian Centre for Social Innovation and Clear Horizon).

The Our Town network consists of two models. The first model includes four communities, Ceduna/Far West, Cummins, Kimba and **Kangaroo Island**, who are each fully funded for the ten years under the initiative by Fay Fuller Foundation.

The second model includes the communities of Berri and Mid Murray who to date have been supported through seed funding and short-term government grants. All six communities receive funded capability development and participate in network learning opportunities.

By working with existing data and evidence, and informed by people's lived experience, Our Town's goal is to generate new ideas and ways of looking at mental health. Our Town sees communities as uniquely positioned to be able to design and implement preventative approaches to mental health. Through providing long-term funding directly to communities we anticipate being able to create deep, lasting change while giving communities the time and space to test what approaches work best for them.

This awesome initiative provides Kangaroo Island the opportunity for our island community to define what is right for **our community** and reclaim our agency. We not only get to be part of the discussion, but we are now in the position to test and try island-led solutions, from our community - for our community towards the wellbeing of our community.



Kangaroo Island Our Town has been working through this journey since 2019 and we officially launched the initiative here on the island in February 2024.




Working Differently

During 2024 **Kangaroo Island Our Town** has been building our team; testing and trying community ideas and developing our grassroots way of granting.

We wanted to get out and about, so we reached out to community who were doing really positive things and offered support for their initiatives. We have connected with many community groups such as KICE, Parenting KI, Black Dog Ride, AgKI, Advance Kingscote Progress Association, local radio, the Community Gardens and the Harvest Exchanges, local musicians and the Kangaroo Island Wildlife Network.


Working with community has given us the opportunity to test and try our ways of working and develop our community granting process. In all decisions we try keep things local to support our local economy (community groups or businesses) as much as possible.

- · Chat with us and tell us about your idea
- Little to no paperwork a conversation is your grant process
- Share your idea alongside other community ideas - this sharing allows you to engage and be curious - building each idea as we go
- We work together to see what impact your idea may have - guided by our Theory of Change
- If your idea needs a little work to ensure it is inclusive of all islanders - that is okay, we will work with you to shape and reshape it until it is
- We trust you to test and try it and it is okay if it doesn't work - let's look at what impact you did see and what you can do next
- · And if it does GREAT what next??




